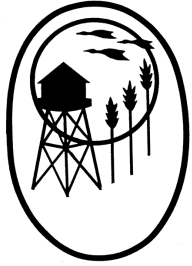

Notes from the Village Office

The Municipal Elections take place in Alberta on October 18, 2021.

This includes the five Council positions overseeing the Village of Berwyn.

Membership on Village Council is a rewarding opportunity to provide leadership in the community, and be involved in regional boards and agencies dealing with activities like economic development; seniors housing; and libraries.

Council meetings are held twice a month and other board meetings are held monthly or quarterly.

Nominations for must be received before 12 noon on Monday September 20th, 2021. The nomination paper must be signed by 5 electors of the Village

Your present Council consists of: Mayor Cindy Hockley; Councilors Ken Montie; Kim Steeves; Brianne Nettelfield; and John Bak.

Nomination forms must be in by noon!

In addition to local elections, electors can also vote on two referendum questions regarding federal equalization payments; and proposed changes to Daylight Savings Time. And there will be a senate election.

Water and recycling rates are increasing. These changes will take effect with the municipal utility bills that are mailed out at the end of August.

The flat rate charged for water use will increase by \$1.00 per month. The rate for water consumption will increase from \$2.00 per cubic metre to \$2.50 per cubic metre. There are 220 imperial gallons in one cubic metre.

Recycling charges increase from \$3.25 per month to \$4.00 per month. These changes have been made to ensure that the water system and our recycling service continue to operate on a cost-recovery basis, without requiring subsidy from property taxes.

Rates for sewer service and garbage collection remain unchanged.

Pavement repair work will start near the end of August. We are looking forward to taking the bumps out of the East entrance to the Village, and paving over a few areas where water mains were installed.

55th Avenue between 50th Street and 51st Street will be repaved, to deal with the base failure there.
