Notes from the Village Office

The Municipal Elections take place in Alberta on October 18, 2021.

This includes the five Council positions overseeing the Village of Berwyn.

Membership on Village Council is a rewarding opportunity to provide leadership in the community, and be involved in regional boards and agencies dealing with activities like economic development; seniors housing; and libraries.

Council meetings are held twice a month and other board meetings are held monthly or quarterly.

For more information on this opportunity, contact Greg Gayton, CAO, at the Village Office, or contact a member of Council. We have nomination forms available at the village office.

Nominations for must be received before 12 noon on Monday September 20th, 2021. The nomination paper must be signed by 5 electors of the Village

Your present Council consists of: Mayor Cindy Hockley; Councilors Ken Montie; Kim Steeves; Brianne Nettelfield; and John Bak.



In the summer, we have one Village Council meeting per month. The next meeting is set for August 19th 7:00 p.m.

Water and recycling rates are increasing. These changes will take effect with the municipal utility bills that are mailed out at the end of August.

The flat rate charged for water use will increase by \$1.00 per month. The rate for water consumption will increase from \$2.00 per cubic metre to \$2.50 per cubic metre. There are 220 imperial gallons in one cubic metre.

Recycling charges increase from \$3.25 per month to \$4.00 per month. These changes have been made

to ensure that the water system and our recycling service continue to operate on a cost-recovery basis, without requiring subsidy from property taxes.

Rates for sewer service and garbage collection remain unchanged.

Village of Berwyn Property tax notices were mailed on June 11, 2021. The last day to pay taxes without 12.00% penalty is Tuesday, August 3, 2021. Please contact the Village Office if you did not receive a notice, and feel that you should have received one.

The Village of Berwyn is opening up its campground in August on a "Pilot Project" basis. The following are the rules for campground use:

This is a casual use campground. There are no services available except for the sewer dumping station at the entrance.

Campground fees are not collected. Instead we are on an "honor system." Donations can be made at the Village Office (5006 – 51st Street) during normal business hours. After-hours payments can also be dropped off through the mail slot at the Village Office. We suggest \$10.00 a night is appropriate.

There is no firewood supplied. But you are welcome to collect the deadwood on the ground in the campground area. Washrooms are supplied with toilet paper and hand sanitizer, and are restocked during normal business hours.

If the campground becomes crowded, occupancy at each site will be limited to three consecutive days.

Loud music and heavy drinking are discouraged. Be considerate of other campers here.
